AJHGO International Student participants on Developing a Global Partnership for Development

AJHGO International,

Reaffirming the United Nations Charter; recalling the principle of achieving international cooperation in solving international problems of an economic, social, cultural, or humanitarian character,

Recognizing the interdependence and correlation between development and democracy, stressing the importance of further promotion of fundamental democratic values, such as freedom, equality, solidarity, tolerance, respect for nature, shared responsibility, and the right to sustainable development,

Emphasizing the leading role of Civil Society, with its NGO sector, in achieving public awareness of, and respect for, human rights, taking note of the role of the United Nations in enhancing legal culture and strengthening the rule of law,

Observing that acceleration of meaningful partnerships for development between the States must include, in addition to increased aid and debt relief to developing countries, a further opening of borders, an increasing transfer of technology, and a strengthening of the rule of law to foster financial stability,

Aware of the obstacles that landlocked and developing States face in their efforts to participate in international organizations that promote economic growth through an enhancement of production, imports, and exports,

Recognizing the significance of the active involvement of youth in the process of cultural and educational exchange, taking note of the knowledge and familiarity of youth with regard to Information Society Development,


Encouraging States to take measures to develop and implement strategies to accomplish the goal of global collaboration and cooperation,

1. Recommends that member States cooperate toward creating regional free trade zones, which would lead to partnerships for development and facilitate the resolution of conflicts;
2. Recommends the more active promotion of legal culture, which includes the responsibility of monitoring, imposing sanctions, and other measures intended to strengthen the rule of law;
3. Requests that the UN develop curricula to provide education and training for careers in government, diplomacy, and international aid, thereby creating knowledgeable and skilled State officials and representatives of Civil Society;
4. Calls upon all States to raise public awareness of, and advocate for, human rights and freedoms;
5. Recommends undertaking further strengthening of the NGO sector through grants, membership appeals, fundraising, and in particular widening the scope of activities of the World Federation of UN Associations in member States.


